SUMMARY

Revelation reveals the final chapter of God's redemptive plan: Jesus will return in glory to judge evil, renew creation, and reign forever as King. Believers are called to live in hope and readiness, trusting in the promise of His eternal rule and presence.

NOTES

Revelation is a prophetic book written in apocalyptic language, rich with symbols and visions that speak to spiritual realities. Its purpose is not to stir fear or controversy, but to encourage believers with the assurance that Christ will triumph, evil will be defeated, and God's eternal kingdom will be established.

Christ Will Return in Glory

- Jesus is coming again—this time as the victorious King, not the suffering servant. - Revelation 19:11–16
- His return will be visible, powerful, and final. - Acts 1:11; Matthew 24:30
- He comes to defeat evil and establish justice. - Revelation 19:19–21
- This is a promise, not a theory—Jesus Himself said, “I will come back.” - John 14:3

Judgment and Justice Will Be Established

- Christ will judge all people with perfect righteousness. - Revelation 20:11–15
- Evil, death, and Satan will be fully and finally defeated. - Revelation 20:10
- Believers are secure—those in Christ are written in the Book of Life. - Revelation 20:12; Romans 8:1
- Justice will be complete, and God's holiness fully revealed. - 2 Thessalonians 1:7–10

A New Heaven and New Earth Will Be Revealed

- God will renew creation—no more death, mourning, or pain. - Revelation 21:1–5
- The New Jerusalem will descend, and God will dwell with His people. - Revelation 21:2–3
- Everything broken will be restored; the curse will be lifted. - Revelation 22:3
- Believers will live in eternal joy, light, and fellowship with God. - Revelation 22:4–5

Believers Are Called to Hope and Readiness

- Revelation ends with a call to stay faithful and expectant: “Come, Lord Jesus!” - Revelation 22:20
- We are invited to live in hope, not fear. - Titus 2:13; 1 Peter 1:13
- The Spirit and the Bride say “Come”—an open invitation to eternal life. - Revelation 22:17
- Our role is not to predict, but to prepare and remain faithful. - Matthew 24:44; Revelation 3:11

KEY POINTS

2. His coming will bring final judgment, the defeat of evil, and the restoration of justice.
